Here's an introduction to the training course "Digital Literacy On Human Rights Education", that will be held in the metropolitan area Chieti-Pescara (Italy), from November 26<sup>th</sup> to December 03<sup>rd</sup> 2015. The project is co-funded by the European Commission through its programme Erasmus+ (Key Action 1 – Mobility projects in the fields of education, training and youth).

## ABOUT THE TRAINING

**Location:** metropolitan area Chieti-Pescara (Abruzzo, Italy)

**Arrival day:** November 26<sup>th</sup> - **Departure day:** December 03<sup>rd</sup> .

Board and lodging are 100% covered by the Erasmus+ grant. Participants are given 2 days prior the TC kick-off and 2 after its end as maximum flexibility to purchase the tickets.

**Extra costs will not be covered by the budget.** Thus, if participants decide to stay in Italy beyond the period above specified (November 26<sup>th</sup> – December 03<sup>rd</sup>), they will have to arrange board and lodging at their own expenses.

**Countries committed:** Italy - Albania – Bosnia-Herzegovina - Cyprus – Greece - Kosovo – Montenegro – Netherlands - Romania – Serbia – Turkey.

**Number of participants per country:** 3 (no age limit). Please respect gender balance.

This TC is addressed to activists, teachers, trainers, volunteers, youth workers and in general to people working in the fields of education, training and voluntary work, especially in marginalised areas. We encourage partner organisations to pick candidates having a good proficiency in the english language, plus keen in human rights, intercultural dialogue, social networks and ICT. In addition, the selected participants will have to assure their active and punctual participation to all the scheduled activities, being enthusiasts and respectful of the group, the materials that will be supplied as well as the spaces around them.

## DESCRIPTION

This training course is aimed to increase the level of civic participation in Human Rights protection, by providing human right education to marginalised and isolated activists through ICT.

The main objectives of this training course will be to:

- develop a tool box on Digital HRE and explore the main tools of ICT used in HRE.
- conceive a "useful-links" list on HRE.
- develop skills in the use of social media.

The TC remarks the need of educational tools for youth workers and activists working in isolated areas or within marginalised groups. Thus we will contribute to the civic

participation and activism, by enabling activists who are in isolated areas or marginalised communities, with skills and tools to be active in online platforms, exchanging informations and raising awareness to a wider public.

The TC points to foster the use of ICT among youth workers, by:

- developing their digital literacy in internet use,
- providing a thorough scenario about HRE situation in ones countries and Europe in general,
- improving skills in searching, selecting and sharing of information,
- encouraging the team spirit and the feeling of European citizenship,
- meeting local activists/NGOs and exploring stories of HRE in practice.

The use of internet to exchange informations, has made the society more informed. Selecting the genuine information, by confirming it through several trusted sources, expressing the reality as it is, in order to emphasize the European values, is the driving philosophy of this training course. We will use non-formal education, combined with real examples and case studies. In this frame we will provide basic skills on Human Right Education and digital tools and links that will be shared among participants. Skills and experience shall be exchanged through team work and local visits.

## LOCATION

**Chieti** is a hilltop town nearly 200 km east by north-east of Rome and few kilometers away from the Adriatic Sea, overlooking the Pescara valley 330mt above the sea level. It's one of the most ancient inhabited areas in Italy, with roots dating back to pre-Roman times when, as capital of the Marrucini tribe, it was known as Teate or Teti. The latter name recalls legends telling the town was founded by the Greek warrior Achilles, the central character of Homer's Iliad. Teti was indeed Achille's mother. Nowadays the town counts approximately 53000 inhabitants and it's one of the main artistic, cultural and historical sites in the whole middle Italy. The list of main sights includes: the cathedral of St. Justin and its crypt, the Roman ruins and the archeological site "La Civitella", the underground tunnels, the "Villa Comunale" and the Marrucino Theatre.

**Pescara** is the most populous city in the Abruzzo region (150.000 inhabitants circa) and a popular seaside resort, having a long promenade with beaches along the Adriatic Sea. The town was the birthplace of Gabriele D'Annunzio and Ennio Flaiano, two prominent Italian writers. Pescara has a very lively nightlife and it's one of the main commercial districts of the Adriatic coast.

**By plane** (<http://www.skyscanner.com/>)

The **Aeroporto Internazionale D'Abruzzo**, is the nearest to the venue (10 km). It operates flights from/to: Barcelona-Girona, Bergamo-Orio Al Serio, Bruxelles-Charleroi, Bucarest, Düsseldorf-Weeze, Frankfurt-Hahn, London-Stansted, Milan-Linate, Paris-Beauvais, Rome-Fiumicino and Tirana.

#### Other options

Rome Ciampino and Rome Fiumicino are the main reference airports and the nearest ones right after the above mentioned Aeroporto D'Abruzzo. They are nearly 230 km far and the journey to the venue takes 3 hours circa, depending on the means of transportation.

The easiest way to reach Chieti and Pescara from the Roman airports is by bus. Passengers are picked right outside the exit and straight headed to Abruzzo by regular buses. In this case, the price for a roundtrip ticket is about 40 EUR, to be added to the price of the flight. Buy your ticket aboard or here: <http://www.prontobusitalia.it/index.php?lang=en>

Those arriving to Rome in large advance for a sightseeing, may consider to reach Chieti or Pescara from the Tiburtina bus station. The hub is reachable by subway from all the main sights, as well as from the train station indoor the Fiumicino airport. In this case, in addition

to Prontobus there are buses operated by the Abruzzo's regional bus company "ARPA".

**Please note:** In all the cases, we discourage the use of trains to move from Rome to Chieti and Pescara as the railway is old and the journey too long. A list of additional airports you may consider as arrival includes Ancona, Bari and Bologna.

### By bus

Rome aside, Pescara can be reached from several Italian cities. Tickets booked in large advance with Flixbus can be extremely cheap (2/3 EUR for a roundtrip ticket). Flixbus has routes from/to Ancona, Bari, Bologna, Foggia, Rimini and Venezia. Eurolines is the alternative from/to the same and more non mentioned destinations.

### By ferry

Participants from the other shore of the Adriatic sea may consider to reach Ancona, Bari, Brindisi or Venezia by ferry and then move to Chieti or Pescara by bus or train.

### By train

Trains can be used or combined to other means, especially to reach Pescara from the main cities on the east coast of Italy, rather than from Bologna or Milan. If you want to move to the hotel independently, then once outside the station you have to head towards this place, that is the ticket office for local buses:



There you have to purchase a ticket for the bus n. 7 in direction San Silvestro. A ticket costs 1.20 EUR and it's valid 90 minutes. Buses leave each 30 mins right outside the ticket office. Once aboard ask the driver to stop in front of the "Parc Hotel Vila Immacolata".

**Please note:** this is the stop for Prontobus and ARPA lines from/to Rome.

**IMPORTANT:** We only reimburse the 100% of eligible travel costs, within here below listed limits. Buses, flights, ferries and trains are eligible costs. **Taxi fares are not eligible costs and thus will not be refunded.** Regardless the time of arrival, a shuttle van will pick up participants in Chieti or Pescara and drive them to the hotel. The service is free of charge and will be supplied by the hotel itself rather than the organisers.
